Guidelines for Digital Images for Digital Competitions

1- Set your color working space to the **sRGB** standard. This is the color gamut that is used for E-Mail, monitor and digital projector viewing.

2- From your scanned slide or negative or digital camera image, set the size of your edited image. If using Photoshop, go to image>image size, and check the constrain proportions.

a) For a horizontal image, set only the horizontal pixel width to 1024b) For a vertical or square image, set only the vertical pixel height to 768

Click OK. Do not be concerned about document size, resolution, or file size.

3- The photographer may make any manipulation, enhancement, modification, cropping, or removal of distracting elements, that can be done in-camera, or in the "digital darkroom", to improve the presentation of the image. However this should **not** significantly **alter** the original scene.

The combining of multiple images is allowed for the purpose of increasing the Dynamic Range (HDR), or for "stitching" adjacent images, such as in the case of panoramas.

So, adjust the color, brightness and contrast your photo.

4- Sharpen your image suitable for digital projection (Sharpen>UnSharp Mask>50 to 100). Almost all digital or scanned digital images require some sharpening. Do not over-sharpen. Do not adjust anything after sharpen.

For color accuracy from your screen to our projector it is strongly advised that you calibrate your monitor. We will not be making any corrections or adjustments to the submitted images. **5**- Save your photo as JPG (JPEG), high resolution (12). During editing, never save your photo; it reduces the quality of the photo. Just save once after finishing your work and do nothing after that.

6- Rename your photo: "Title of the Photo-Complete name of Photographer", like:

"The Road Is Closed-Massoud Karimaei.jpg"

Use capital letter for the beginning of each word. Leave a blank space between words.

7- Send your photos for the competitions by email. CD or Flash Memory is not accepted. Write down "The name of Competition" and "your Name" on the SUBJECT of the email.

8- Pay the fee of the competition at the same time you send your photos. The responsibility of separate sending, and loosing the receipt of the fee goes back to the photographer, not CPC.

Caroun Photo club will not be making any corrections or adjustments to the submitted images.

Photos should have all the above-mentioned specifications, otherwise will be canceled.

Important Points

1- Photos will be showed as Digital AV.

2- Make a big 300 dpi of each of photos ready for exhibition, print in magazines and bulletin, website... You can send this copy with your competition copy too.

3- CPC has the right to publish these photos in publications and website... under the name of photographer. Copyright remains for the photographer.

4- **Nature photography** refers to the wide range of images devoted to photographic observations from all branches of natural history in an honest and true representation.

Evidence of the "hand of man" must **not** be present in any part of the image. Photographs of cultivated plants, domestic animals, and taxidermy specimens are **not** allowed. The presence of scientific bands or collars is acceptable, but should be minimal.

Photo Color Enhancement Farhad Azizi

Enhancing colors of a photograph gives warmer tones therefore more effective mainly for nature and portrait photography. To do we have 3 choices:

1- Enhancing filter. But they are fixed on one degree and very expensive. One of the best is Tiffen for \$50.

2- Photoshop; but it is very difficult to obtain the quality of filter.

3- Now, you get good quality enhancement free of charge by little time spending as below:

- 3-A: go to menu of camera
- 3-B: select white balance adjustment

3-C: scroll left/right - up/down to reach desire effect.

3-D: save and start photography.

The main advantage is you can change the color tones according to the subject matter.





When a photographer decides to shoot an extraordinary exceptional photo, his/her mind would lead him/her to the appropriate situation. How he/she finds himself/herself there is completely related to his wish; however, people often relate it to the chance! But I, not ignoring the high value of photographer's knowledge and experience, do not believe in chance at all! I think that knowledge and experience are just as an entrance ticket to the wonderful world of image recording.

Furthermore, our world is completely about transformation of matter to energy and vice versa; the transformation that is rooted in our dreams, whatever they are. When we step forward with confidence, trust and hope, our dreams come to us as if they were already there! So in such a reasonable Universe where we live in, how could one believe in existence of chance, even in photography!











Photo Tip: Photographers & Designers

Babak Rezaei, Iran

At first glance a well executed design appears effortlessly sleek, as though it just came together naturally. As designers and photographers well know, there's a lot more work and planning going into an unforgettable creation than meets the eye.

For photographers, when conceptualizing a stock image, it's wise to think forward to what designers will be able to use in their projects.

Choose bold, but not garish complimentary colors. Use models and props that will fit into a larger concept. Visual communicators favor minimal backgrounds for elements like logos and text, so steer clear of clutter and busy-looking props.

Once you've found the photo that's going to be the anchor of your creation, try working with colors from within the photo to add impact to layout elements such as typography. In order to choose a color native to the file, select the color picker, aka the eye dropper tool in Photoshop, and then click on the area that will become the color of your text. Once you've identified the color, it should match with a part of the photo that best expresses the core message of your design. For example, red text matching the lipstick of a sultry model may imply something provocative uttered by a female.

Philosophy of Photography, Farhad Azizi, 2009

Human beings are social and could improve themselves into social life, of course not like some wild animals. Exactly, at this point I should say: "Photography is not just Art, but a need for social life improvement". Through this medium we obtain a very strong opportunity and that is "Judgment", no matter it is a photo of fish, cat, flower, man and woman or anything else. All of them let us see, pause and then think, about bad and good, and why they are bad or good. Thanks to photography, this "*Why*" is thinking!

Exactly, at this stage the "Critic" comes to exist. Even though the "Critic" is very important, it should not be done by a specialist. Many of the framed and hanged on the walls of the rooms in houses do not have accredited note as an art work by a specialist, but they have given a kind of sense to a person to appreciate and then pay for it. This is the philosophy beyond said picture.

Photograph, by itself and even separate from photographer's taught, could establish a relationship between itself and owner, buyer or, who look at it even in the other part of the world. The relationship could be logical, sensational or both. At this point, we do not think of good or

bad, as we have a mutual social understanding. Viewers may like, dislike, or even hate a Photograph, but it is not important anymore. What is important the creation of the relation between "Photograph" and the "Viewer". This relation becomes stronger, when the viewer stops much to visit the Photo, which shows the depth of social philosophy beyond the photo.

Sometimes it seems artistic photography is loosing chair to the art of photography. Why? Because, as I said before, Photography as a strong social medium helps human being all around the world to have better understanding of each other. From the first days, Photography has a kind of social philosophy, which has become stronger everyday.
