Mobilography or photography,Leyla Mohammadi



Nowadays taking photo with smart phones, in family parties and events is too common, especially for people, who want to share their images on social media is hassle free. There is so many apps and software to edit the photos, such as Cropping, changing white balance on smart phones. Moreover, they don't need to transfer their photos on the computer and using

different software like light room or photo shop.

If you don't do photography for life, probably it should be done with your camera on an occasion or just on weekend, but there is a different story when you use your smart phone for photography. Smartphone has light weight and easy to carry, which is count as an advantages, moreover you have more chance to capture scenes over and over spontaneously and eventually you will train your eyes to learn about composition and light.

The question is, dose compact camera or SLR cameras and smart phone's photos have the same quality? In this article we will give you some hints about this two method of photography.

Sensor dimensions will effect on the photo noises and depth of field, so you could imagine the enhancement of photos with camera on smart phone due to size of sensors.

We are going to compare the taken photos with smartphone and amateur compact camera on the screen and not printed one.

Landscape photography with natural light

If you are not going to print the taken images, you will not see significant differences between taken photo with your smartphone and compact camera. New technology on smartphone camera's sensor will give you less noises and depth of field.

Indoor photography

when you do photography in jpg format with indoor lighting, you wouldn't see too much differences in two different method especially when you use flash light.

Portrait photography

SLR cameras can focus on the main subject and makes blurry background. In the past smartphones did not have this technology, then



with iPhone 7 the problem solved but still you can see the differences on skin's colors and details.

Photography from long distance

you will be able to zoom in for long distances with changing your camera's lenses but still smartphones like iPhone 7 is not good enough to zoom in more than two time to keep the details so moreover you have to use digital zoom that will have significant effect on your photos.



Conclusion

Even though, smart phones are easy to carry and with automatic setting system, any one can do photography but dilemma will happen, when you print the picture out! Moreover, your purpose of photography and your budget will show you the path to record your memories and events.







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Photography on the Move Armin Masoomabadi

Sometimes when you're on the move on a journey, whether in a taxi or on a bus or train, suddenly a scene catches your eyes such that if the camera is not available to capture that very moment, you may never be able to see it, you may regret.

Therefore, you always have to tolerate the weight of the camera on your hands and neck so, that you won't miss a subject.

To this end, you need to have the appropriate filters installed, paying attention to aperture and shutter, to capture the subject right away.

On a cloudy and a little bit of gloomy day, I was on a tour bus in Shanghai looking around attentively. All of a sudden a number of items appeared in front of my camera that made me capture images regarding immigration.

Adjusted ISO on 100, I set the white

balance to Cloudy and by using an ND filter, to have better and more real quality, better than editing by PhotoShop, I started shooting



the subjects.

ND filter reduces the amount of the light, so you need to open the aperture more; so, the light surfaces as the sky and the clouds won't be burned the dark components won't be darker.


Purchasing low quality filters may even change color and reduce the quality of the photo; so high quality filters are suggested. Graduated ND filters are the best.

But care should be taken when purchasing these filters because its low quality may even change color and reduce the quality of the photo.

In this case, when you're on the move, you have to wait until a

few elements are fully coordinated. Once all these incidents happen altogether under the best conditions, press the shutter button.

It's cold and drippy: Towers and sky scrapers shrouded fog cloud. and in A bridge with crossed out pillars, miserable but determined face on a murky lake and а person is passing by with her briefcase! It's seems all of these elements were waiting to be captured.



Despite the cloudy weather and the lack of a lot of light sources, there were no tarnished, colorless and dull shots coming out. I was lucky, because the air was clean due to the precipitation from the previous night and the lack of smoke and pollutants made the images come out clean.

At the time of returning from Shanghai to Beijing, we ran a fast train that showed us the natural beauty of the landscape.








There wasn't enough time to think to make an decision about capturing. I kept taking photo.

When I aligned the photos in Photoshop together, such images were formed, which I say are the elongation of time!

In my opinion, photography on the move offers subjects and interesting ideas to the photographer, each of which is unique.

Try it once, for sure you will be excited about the results.

Works and documents should be well packed and sent as mentioned above, otherwise will not be exhibited and the fee will not be returned. Mailing costs should be paid by the artists. Fees could be paid cash, by cheque or online.




