Fraser Cemetery



Vancouver and rain are kind of besties, you can't call one without another one. I was supposed to do indoor photography, but

I changed my mind and in the meantime I stopped at Fraser Cemetery in Vancouver.

One of the ideal situations for a photographer is doing photography in a rainy day. However I wasn't preparing for the situation, even though I solved the issue with a plastic bag. I'm going to review some simple tips for doing photography in a rainy weather.

In this condition of weather, rain drops and different lighting will be very important to take sharp and focused photos. So, to do this, I had to close the aperture to get more depth of field.



The other setting that you need to take care of is white balance. Best option for rainy condition is manual mood. If you are going to show your scene cold and dark, then you need to put the Kelvin number on small numbers. On the other hand if you are going to give warm colors use higher numbers. But sometime it looks time consuming and you might lose the scenario, so we can set the Kelvin number on 5500 or even automatic setting, then you will have time to do any changes later.

You need to take care of your camera. You should keep it dry all the time and in case it gets wet, you should dry it as fast as you can, remove battery and memory in case.

Don not place under the gutter for photography.

Be aware of cars that passing through the puddle, water will splash on you and of course to your camera.

Using an umbrella will not keep your camera dry, when rain and wind are both together.



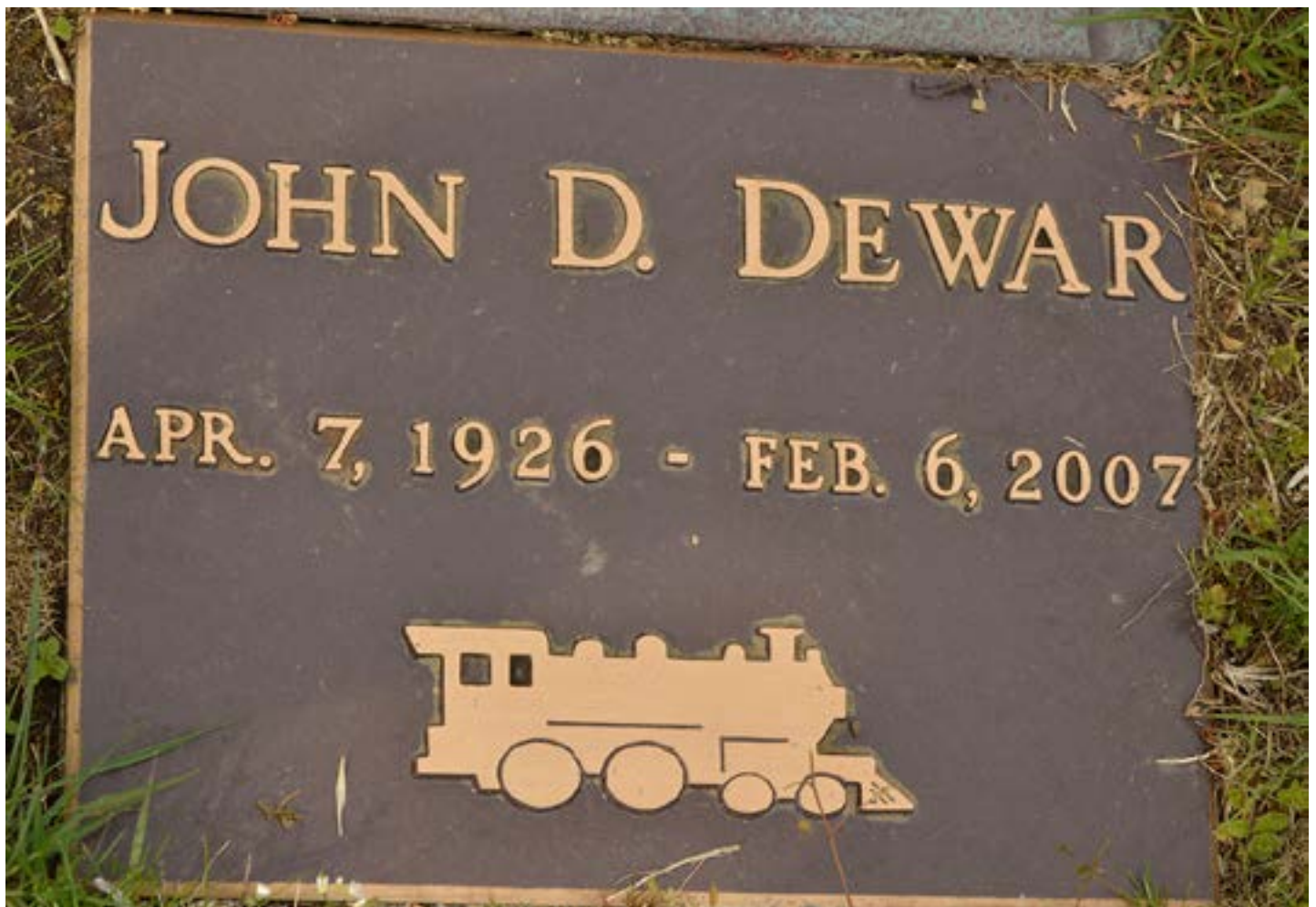


Usually talking about cemeteries or graveyards isn't a pleasant topic to talk about and is sometimes thought as a scary place to visit, but this uncomely corner is part of every country's history and culture.

The cemetery is located at the heart of Vancouver. Rain washed the beautiful stones with their unique designs and letters and they look shiny as well as fresh grass on the ground.



Unique words such as "Father", "Mother" and even "Son" are engraved on the head stones. It seems that in the past, it wasn't popular to write the name of the person who passed away. On some stones, different symbols are carved in like hammers, ships and even trains, these symbols might represent the person's careers or interests.





Columbarium wall, niches with flowers, plaques showing different types of traditional ways to bury, however it's not a new method and similar to the Buddhist form used in temples.

Close to the water fountain there was an area that contained a very interesting object, The Amphoras. They stand beside each other and they remind me of the Hafez, Iranian poet, which said "eventually we will become a clay for potter". It seems as if they believed, what we believe.



It looks like that part of art is lies in peace, away from the competitive world and any hassle.

So do not panic, you won't see ghosts! Plan to visit to a cemetery in your next trip!

On rainy days make sure that you carry some plastic bags with you. You just need to make a hole to let camera's lens out of the plastic bag.

so rain couldn't be an excuse for missing unique photos, it's worth. Try it.

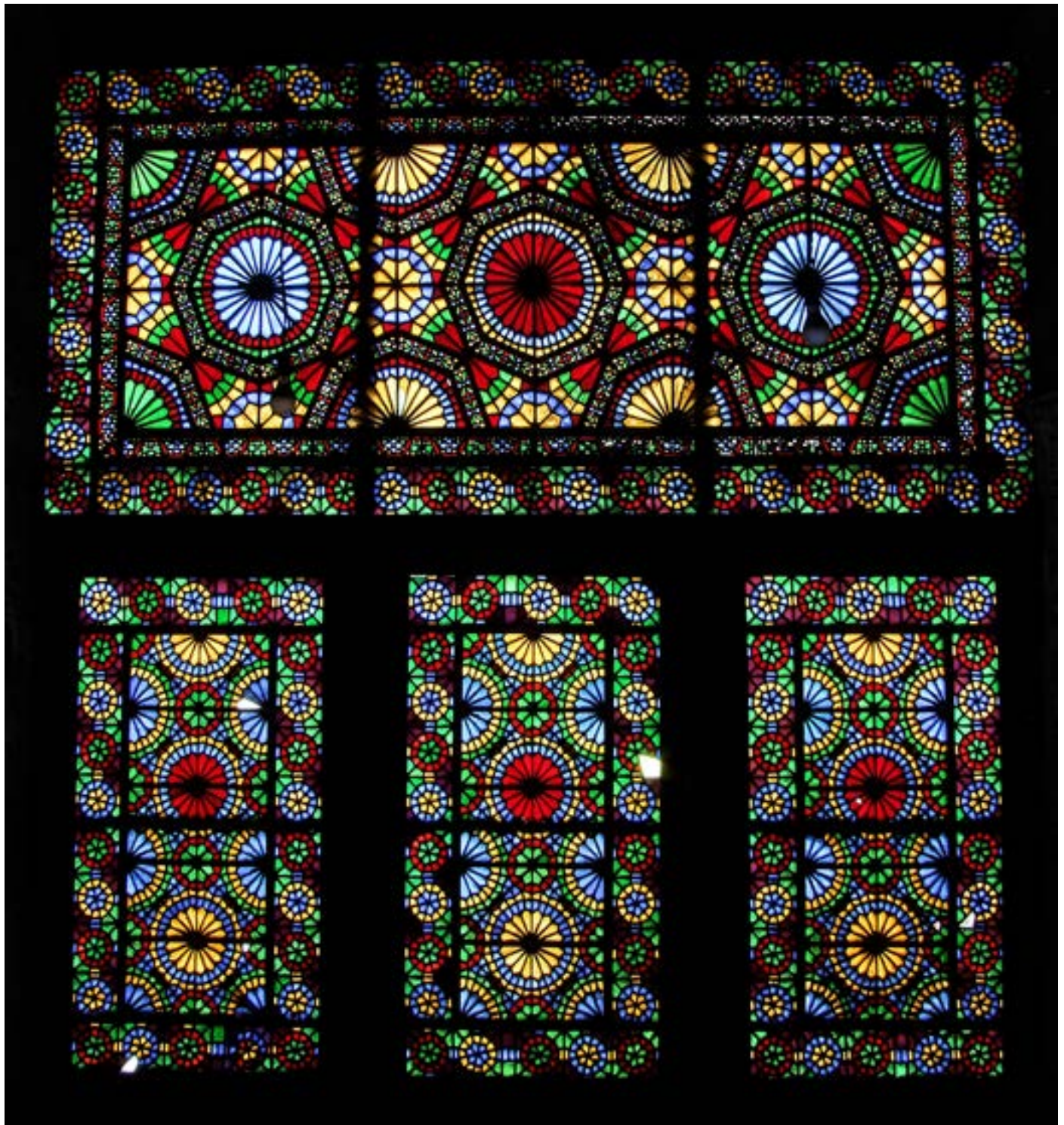

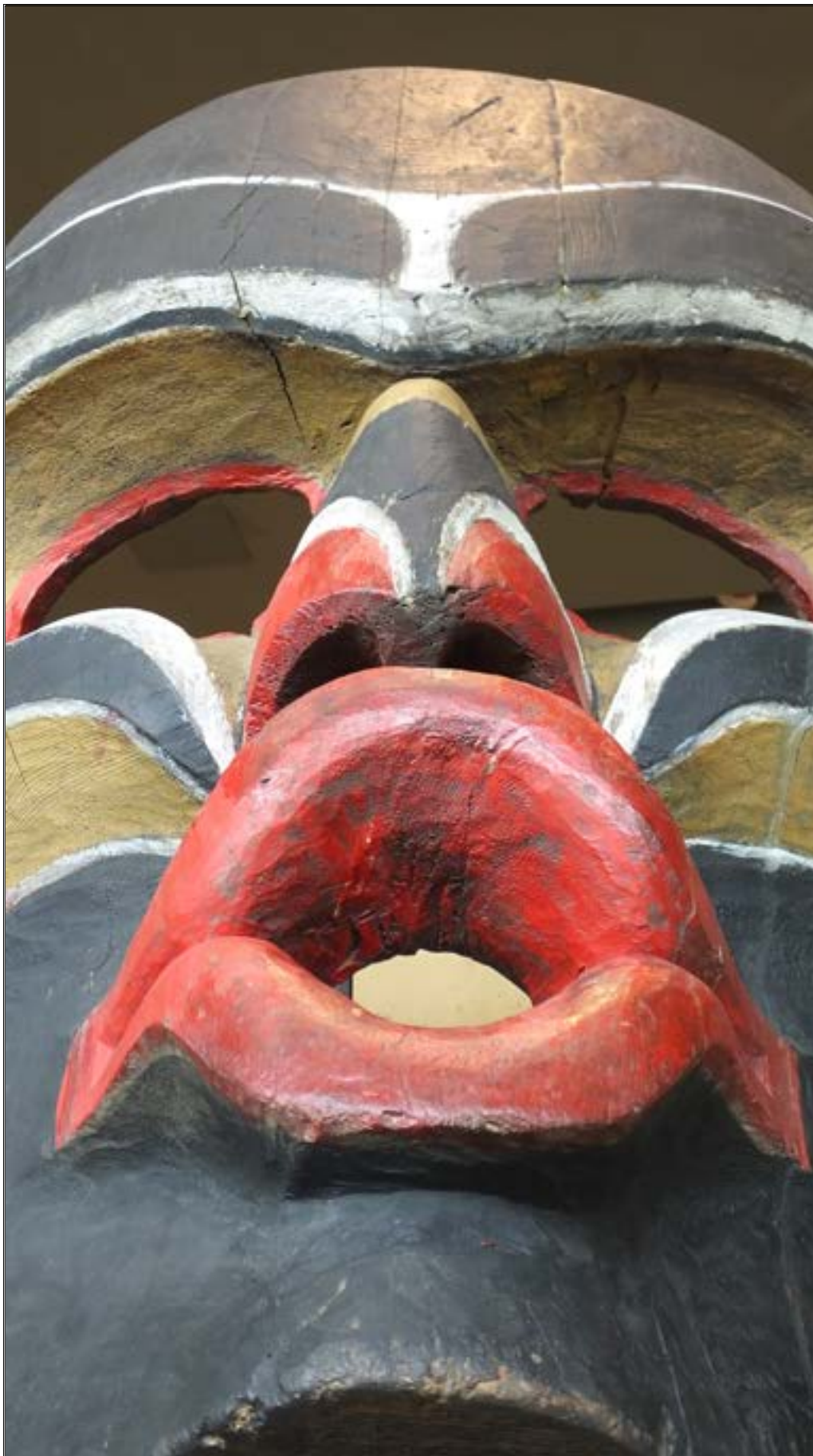
